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## Dear Parent/Guardian:

I am writing this letter to notify you that CM Eppes Middle School\_has been dually designated as both a North Carolina Low-Performing school and a federally identified Targeted Support & Improvement Additional Targeted Support (TSI-AT) school by the North Carolina State Board of Education.

As defined in G.S. 115C-105.37: "The State Board of Education shall identify low-performing schools on an annual basis. Low-performing schools are those that earn an overall school performance grade of D or F and a school growth score of "met expected growth" or "not met expected growth" as defined by G.S. 115C-83.15." Legislation (G.S. §115C-83.15) passed during the 2013 long North Carolina General Assembly session provides parents with an additional measure of school performance in the form of School Performance Grades. Beginning with the 2013–14 school year, the annual North Carolina School Report Cards display a letter grade of A, B, C, D, or F for each school in the state.

School Performance Grades are based 80 percent on our school's achievement score (student proficiency) and 20 percent on students' academic growth. At CM Eppes Middle School, our achievement score for the 2023-2024 school year is based on how well our students performed on the following End of Grades Tests: Math, ELA, 8th Grade Science & Math I.CM Eppes Middle School\_received a School Performance Grade of D\_and a growth designation of *Did Not Meet* for the 2023-2024 school year.

In addition, per the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) Section 1111(d)(2), schools receive the federal identification of TSI-AT in North Carolina by having one or more of the following subgroups receive a subgroup performance grade score at or below the lowest 5% of schools across the state during the 2022-2023 academic year; and being identified as a consistently underperforming subgroup for the previous year. Subgroup performance scores are provided for the following subgroups of students: (1) Students with Disabilities, (2) Economically Disadvantaged, (3) Black, (4) White, (5) Hispanic, (6) Asian-Pacific Islander, (7) Multi-racial, and (8) English Learners.

As a dually designated TSI-AT and NC low-performing school, CM Eppes Middle School\_is required to develop a comprehensive improvement plan that specifically addresses how the school will improve student achievement. The plan will also include strategies that our

district or charter will employ to support CM Eppes Middle School\_improvement efforts. The comprehensive improvement plan will address the following areas:

- Classroom Management
- Standards-aligned Instruction
- Professional Learning Teams (PLTs)
- Instructional Leadership
- Recruitment & Retention of Effective Teachers
- Support for Grade-to-Grade Transitions
- Implementation of a Tiered Instructional System
- Data-Driven Decision Making
- Student Support Services
- Family and Community Engagement

We have set the following goals for CM Eppes Middle School\_this year:

- CME will ensure that at least 50% if all professional development sessions conducted are differentiated to meet the needs of the teachers.
- CME will increase overall achievement by 4% with implementation of the following high yield strategies from the LFLP Instructional Framework, Vocabulary Instruction, Collaborative Pairs & Advanced Organizers/Essential Questions
- CME will move indicators from developing to sustaining as measured by the PLC at Work Continuum: Laying the Foundation
- CME will progress from emerging to developing with the implementation infrastructure as indicated by items 7-16 of the FAM-S
- $\cdot$  CME will reduce the number of instructional days lost due to suspension by 5% as compared to the previous school year.

Here are some strategies that CM Eppes Middle School will be implementing to improve student outcomes:

- Intervention Block for Math & ELA
- Small Groups
